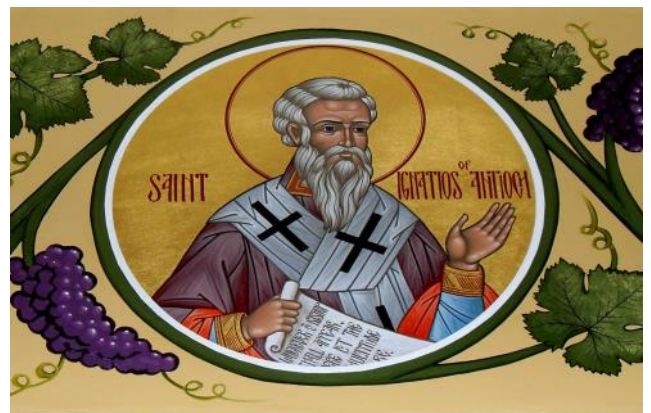

DEACON LUCIO'S HOMILY HOMEWORK

Trinity: It's all about relationships



There's a story of Saint Augustine walking along a beach, contemplating the great mystery of the Trinity. He sees a boy who had dug a hole in the sand, going back and forth from the sea, bringing water to pour into that hole. Augustine asked him, "What are you doing?" "I'm gonna pour the entire ocean into this hole." "Why that's impossible," said Augustine, "the ocean won't fit into the hole you've made." The boy replied: "Nor can you, sir, fit the Trinity into your puny little brain."

The Trinity is certainly more than we can comprehend with our wee little brains. It truly is, as the nuns taught us, *a mystery*; but while God is way beyond our ability to fully understand, what is revealed by the dogma of the Trinity is that God is *relational* - as the very name for each Person, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is their relationship and connection to each other.

Science in fact is verifying that all is connected – Everything exists in relationships. This is evident on the biological level – as all the systems in our bodies function in relationship to one another. In the physical world, everything is relational as well from what the sun does with plants in photosynthesis to the bees which pollinate. All of these relationships make life possible.

And now we know that there is even relationality at the subatomic level. It is called *quantum entanglement*, a physical phenomenon where pairs or groups of particles interact in ways such that the quantum state of each particle cannot be described independently of the others. The particles are able to maintain their relational properties with one another across great distances, remaining intimately linked to each other, even if separated by billions of light years of space; a change induced in one will affect the other no matter the distance. Physicist Paul Oyrac describes it in a way my wee little brain can grasp: *Pick a flower on earth and you move the farthest star.*

Our God then is not just relational within the Godhead – Trinity, but enters into a personal relationship with you and me; what we Catholics call, the *indwelling* of the Trinity. And we are brought into this relationship at our Baptism.

We are baptized into an intimate relationship with each Person of the Trinity.

Our baptism makes us children of the Father; sisters and brothers to one another.

Our baptism makes us followers and disciples of the Son, Jesus Christ.

Our baptism makes us temples and dwelling places of the Holy Spirit.

But each of these relationships are not an end in themselves, but give us a mission.

From our relationship with the Father, we are sent to secure the dignity of all human beings as children of God, speaking out whenever that dignity is threatened.

From our relationship with the Son, we are sent to further the Kingdom Jesus proclaimed, sharing its *Good News* of liberation and healing for all persons.

From our relationship with the Holy Spirit, we are sent to work for peace and unity among all peoples, to truly *renew the face of the earth*, so violent and divided.

The mystery of the Trinity then is not so much something we try to grasp or possess with our *puny little brains*, but a mystery that grasps and possesses us so that the Triune God might come to *indwell* the whole world, *igniting* the earth with love and peace.

So for your homily homework this week, prayerfully ponder the mystery of the Trinity with these questions to guide you.

- 1.) What role does belief in the Trinity play in my life?
- 2.) Which Person of the Trinity do I most relate to in my prayer?
- 3.) Why do you think the discoveries of science confirm what we believe about God? Had I thought of this before?
- 4.) Take a walk in nature to notice the interrelatedness of everything you see.
- 5.) Can I imagine my life without significant relationships? Who have been some of those relationships?

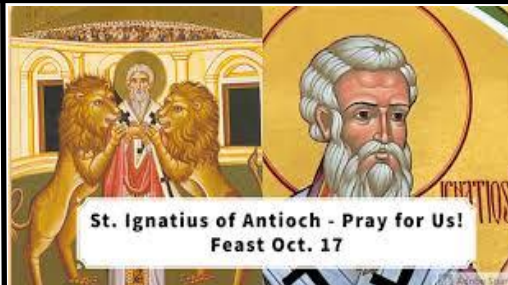
