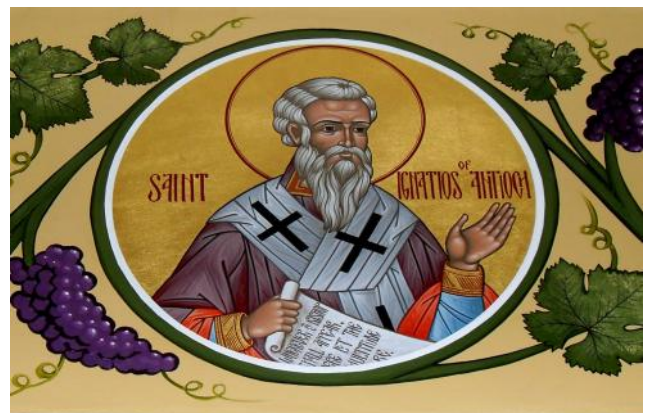

Deacon Lucio's Homily Homework.

Corpus Christi

I bet we all remember our very *first* crush or *first* love? I can remember each one and the names of the girls. I also remember my first of many heartbreaks as well!

We all have many *firsts*... Perhaps our *first* kiss. The very *first* time we drove the car. As parents, maybe the *first* Christmas we celebrated with a child; or as a deacon, that *first* Mass we served at and read the gospel.

I am sure we all remember our First Communion? We mustn't forget how special it felt receiving the Eucharist for the very *first* time. The gift of Jesus to us, of His very body and blood is something we must never take for granted or let become mere routine. Each communion should be like when we *first* opened a very special gift...

In our reading from Deuteronomy, Moses challenged the people to not forget when God *first* saved them, made them God's people, and fed them with manna on their journey. Saint Paul, in one of the earliest writings of the NT, speaks of one of the *first* things the early Church did – which was to celebrate the Eucharist, participating in sharing the Body and Blood of Christ, which several thousand years later, we do to this very day.

Why? Because just as we can never stop eating, in order to live, so we can never stop receiving the Body and Blood of Christ to live our faith; and, as Jesus promised in the gospel, in order to remain in Him and to live forever! As Jesus said to the Jewish crowds: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever.

Even more, just as *we are what we eat*, so too, our consuming of Christ's Body and Blood, makes us, as St. Paul said, into the Body of Christ; so that we become more and more like Him, and through us, we become His presence in the world! This is what we are sent to be for the world at the end of Mass! What a gift and privilege to share in the Eucharist! Let us then make every Communion like our *First*, with the same joy and excitement of our First Communion. If we do so, Mass can never be boring or routine. I can think of no better commitment to make on this Corpus Christi Sunday.

So, for your spiritual reflection homework this week, ponder the questions and suggestions below...

- What do you remember about your First Communion Day? Do you have some photos or memorabilia you can take out to look at?
- How has the Eucharist sustained your faith over the years, especially in times of struggle or losses?
- Have I thought about how the Eucharist is not just about receiving the real body and blood of Jesus, but of me becoming more and more His body here and now, of becoming His Real Presence for others?
- Make a point to reach out to someone who has been away from the Eucharist for some time and invite them to Mass with you.
- Next week at Mass pay special attention to the Eucharistic Prayer and the actions of the priest during it.
- Consider, if you are not one already, becoming a Minister of Communion to the homebound in the parish, where you can share your personal love of the Eucharist and be Christ's presence to them.

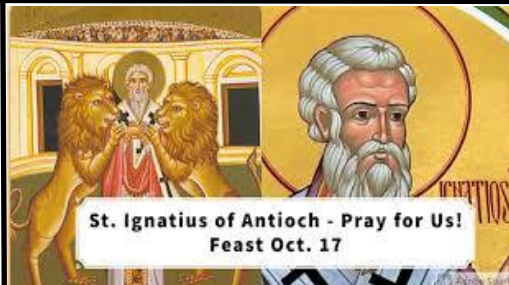
