BAPTISMS—To begin the process of Baptism for either a child or an adult, you must first attend a mandatory Baptismal Preparation Workshop. The workshop will be held three times per year and you may attend any class. Contact the parish office to register.

CONFIRMATION—Annual—Call for information.

EUCHARIST FOR CHILDREN—Usually around the 2nd grade but best as the child is ready.

EUCHARIST FOR HOMEBOUND—Please call the parish office if you wish communion to be brought to you, or a loved one, after the Sunday morning Mass.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK—By request-please contact Parish Office during office hours or if a sacramental emergency, call Fr. David at 402-525-6415. In an emergency if you cannot reach us, all hospitals in Louisville have a priest on call. Notify your nurse that you want a Catholic Priest to come.

RECONCILIATION – one-half hour before weekend Masses in the sacristy unless noted, or by appointment. Use the side door next to the chapel.

MATRIMONY—Please contact the priest at least one year prior to the anticipated date for proper preparation for this sacrament. It is best to contact your priest as soon as you become engaged. Do not set a date before contacting the priest.

FUNERALS- BEFORE SETTING DATES OR TIMES--

Please contact the Parish Office so we can coordinate dates, times, and services with Fr. David. If funeral arrangements are set before being coordinated, **they may have to be altered.**

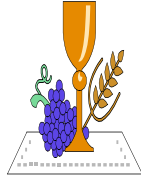

Dear Parishioners of St. Ignatius Martyr Parish:

These are not normal times. We have learned to adjust. During this pandemic, we will continue to champion the Common Good and conduct our public gatherings in a manner which protects the health of our assemblies and others whom they will encounter.

Thank you for the many ways you have shown God's love during this pandemic. And even in the midst of your own fear, thank you for the countless ways that you have sacrificed to serve God's people.

As Mass resumes, our first consideration is for the health and safety of our pastor, deacon, parishioners and those whom they will encounter. Going forward, perhaps for a long time, the celebration of Mass will not be the same as our former Order of Mass.

-Hand Sanitizer will be provided at all church entrances for MANDATORY use.

-Face masks are MANDATORY for those over the age of two.

-Other than family/household units, worshippers should be seated 6 ft. apart in all directions. A row will be left empty between pews. Parishioners may sit every other pew. Seating will be first come, first serve.

-Cry rooms will be closed and locked.

-Our pastor and deacon will be the only Holy Communion ministers, and they will only distribute the Body of Christ. Holy Communion will be held at the conclusion of Mass. Please exit the church following Holy Communion and return to your vehicle following social distancing guidelines.

-There will be no handshake or person-to-person contact at the Sign of Peace.

-There will be no choir or singing.

-There will be no passing of the collection basket. A collection basket and bulletins will be placed on a table at all church entrances. Please drop envelopes into these collection baskets upon entering church.

-No social gatherings associated with Mass (such as Children's Liturgy or coffee & donuts) will occur at this time.

-All non-liturgical gatherings on church property (meetings and activities) are postponed at this time. The annual Parish Picnic is postponed.

Our ability to safely resume Mass is based upon 2 factors:

- 1) Availability of disinfectant and cleaning products
- 2) The willingness of our parishioners to volunteer.

Prayerfully consider being a volunteer. We need 4 ushers and at least 4 church cleaner volunteers for each Mass. If you are a server or eucharistic minister, please consider being an usher/greeter or sacristan during the time your ministry is suspended. If you do not already serve a role in the parish and would like to begin, please volunteer.
